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QGS Construction

Our construction on the Quality Grain Services facility has been moving along nicely all summer. We've added multiple new items and upgraded a few of the old. Overall, we're running on schedule and we plan on having the entire setup ready to begin drying corn by the first of October.

Our biggest upgrade was made to the grain dryer. Our old dryer has now been replaced with the model shown below. It's an MC brand Dryer that can dry 2,000 bushels per hour.

Another recent change that has been made is to the retaining wall. We've removed the old railroad ties and added a wall of stone instead. Pictures of the new wall can be found on the Quality Grain Services website.

This summer we've also added two new bins, and as a result our combined storage capacity is now 500,000 bushels.

Grain Drying Charges

However, because no one is willing to give us a certain fuel price (gas prices are always changing so much), we've been unable to find out exactly what our fuel costs are going to be.




Location
